

Wrightington Mossy Lea Primary School Sports Premium Plan 2017-18

Background: Background – during 2017-18 the DfE will be allocating each school a Sports Premium (£8,000 plus £5 per pupil – total Sports Premium £8,205). However, by Oct 17, this amount could be potentially doubled. For Mossy Lea, this will amount to around £6,400 (Oct 2017), followed in April 2018 by a further £6,400. This money is ring fenced and must be spent on sport and PE.

Objectives:

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1. To raise staff confidence in the delivery of high quality PE and school sport sessions
2. To make use of specialist coaches to deliver sessions alongside staff so that the staff are up-skilled
3. To increase staff awareness of and ability to assess children against the NC objectives
4. To improve the PE and school sport resources and storage so all children have access to good quality equipment
5. To enable children from across the school to participate in regular intra and inter school sports events
6. To celebrate all PE and sports events with the local community
7. To create a sustainable improvement to the schools PE provision and be able to account for the use of the money
