Spring 1 2024- Teddy Bear's Picnic



May I start by wishing you all a happy new year. It was wonderful to listen to all of the children's stories from over the holidays as we prepared for a magical pantomime. Acorn class have quickly settled back into their routines (although a pantomime, marmalade sandwiches and a train station in the classroom was a fabulous way to start a term!) We have some amazing adventures planned for the children over the coming weeks and this curriculum newsletter will tell you all about the units and areas of learning being covered in this half term. All the children in Acorn Class will be learning the same topics but will cover the specific year group expectations for Year R,1,2. Our topic is called 'Teddy Bear's picnic' and many of our activities will relate to this.

Reading books should be sent into school each day and children will be given the opportunity to change these daily. We aim to read with children several times a week and we do encourage children to read at home regularly.

Children are encouraged to bring a drinks bottle to school each day, **filled with water**. I have noticed some children have juice or flavoured water and school policy is water, in line with Change for Life initiatives.

Lunches must come in either a carrier bag that can be binned daily or a small lunch bag/box that can cleaned easily.

All PE kit and school uniform must be **labelled**, so if lost, they can be easily returned to you.

TOPIC

This half term our topic is Teddy Bear's picnic. The children will be immersed in everything Paddington Bear themed with Literacy and the continuous provision helping to amplify their imagination. In Geography they will be asking '_Would you prefer to live on grass or sand? Studying hot and cold areas of the world. In Science, the children will be testing everyday materials to answer the query 'What is the best material for a picnic blanket? After following the adventures of Paddington, in DT, we will be finding out 'What sandwich will I keep under my hat?' The children will develop their food technology skills to design and make their own sandwich. The role play area this half term is a deconstructed one focusing on the children designing and making their own environment and artefacts. As with the start of all our topics, we will discuss it with the children to find out what they already know and what they want to find out. This will form the basis of our weekly planning so that we can try to plan from the children's interests.

Please take some time to talk to your children about the topics, read books and stories, watch programmes and think of some questions they can explore in class.

MATHS

All children should continue to practise their number work on Numbots and times tables rock stars.

Year 1 will begin the half term with a unit on **Addition and Subtraction** – finding and making number bonds and subtraction including crossing 10. They will then move onto unit on **Place Value** (within 20) - representing numbers to 20, one more and one less and comparing numbers within 20.

Year 2 will begin the half term with a unit on **Money**— Count money - pounds (notes and coins) Compare amounts of money, find change and two-step problems. They will then move onto unit on **Multiplication** -Recognising, making and adding equal groups. Use arrays, times and Divide by 2,5,10.

LITERACY

<u>Writing</u>

Our first Literacy unit is '**Do all bears Growl?**' During this topic we will read, enjoy and analyse a whole range of Paddington bear adventures. We will answer questions, give opinions about the stories, discuss the character's thoughts and feelings and make predictions. We will then ask '**Can I write a set of instructions for a teddy bear's picnic?**' We will write instructions to make the sandwiches we have designed in our Food Technology lessons. We will continue to practise using full stops and capital letters and extend our sentences using and, but, so, or, because. To support your child at home, you could read and follow cooking instructions together and talk about any familiar language they can spot.

LITERACY

Reading

Acorn class will continue to develop their reading skills in English and Guided Reading. The Guided Reading book for this half term will be Izzy Gizmo by Pip Jones. This will include word reading and understanding the text. In order to consolidate and develop your child's reading it is important that they read and discuss books on a regular basis at home. Your child should continue to access books online on Bug Club at their reading level. Your children's bookmarks (aligned to their current book band) include a range of questions you can use to discuss the characters and story. As well as using these questions, we will be looking to develop our vocabulary. To do this at home ask your child, when reading a story, to find a word or words which means the same as another. For example, a story mentions a 'little old lady' and the line 'titchy and teeny house'. Ask your child 'can you find me two words which mean small?'. Discuss the vocabulary with them.

In Year 1, the books are closely linked to their phonics learning.

Children should continue to read aloud to an adult as much as possible. From Year 2, they should focus on reading for meaning, as well as decoding – predicting what will happen in the story and why and also thinking about the character's feelings. Naturally, the focus changes and you are no longer working on building up fluency and expression but looking at prediction, deduction and inference. Questions such as 'What do you think . . . will do next?' 'What could happen here?' 'Why is . . . behaving like that?' will help children to develop their higher order reading skills.

Please could you continue to sign and comment in the reading journal – it really helps! Please make sure your child has their reading journal in school every day.

Homework

Homework will continue to be sent out half termly - each half term you will receive a home learning menu. As explained on the menu, you must complete the maths, reading and writing activities but can choose any two options from the other choices from across the curriculum. The homework menu will allow you to be creative and imaginative in what you decide to produce. The hand in date for the activities this half term will be:

Monday, 5th February

Many parents ask if they can help with activities and projects such as this and the answer is most definitely a resounding 'yes'! There is nothing more motivating for a child than an interested adult. The Homework menu has been sent home.
