Science

- Record all the different ways that you have used electricity today. Now organise these activities into 'essential' and 'non-essential'
- Research the history of electricity. Write a fact file.
- Create a warning electricity danger poster.
- Look for ways to save electricity at home — switching off lights, unplugging devices, etc. Keep a diary for a week to show what you have done.

Topic

- Locate 2 different countries on a map and complete research on each of them.
- Go on a walk using a compass and the 8 points on a compass to help navigate you. Include some pictures in your homework book!
- Take/draw pictures of physical or human features in your local area e.g. woods, rivers and buildings.

- Draw a map of your local area, include a key.
